Attendees: Approximately 52 people are on the tour. To help you acquaint yourself with your fellow attendees, a roster may be found at the end of this message.

Bus: **The bus will load at 7:45 a.m. and leave promptly at 8:00 a.m.** The tour bus will leave from the front of the Mystic Lake Casino and Hotel (where the valet parking is). **The bus will not be held for late comers, so please be sure to be on time. Refunds are not provided as ATALM has incurred expenses equal, if not greater than, the registration fee.**

Food and Beverage: You are permitted to bring beverages and food on the bus, but the bus company requests that you do not leave trash. If you are not taking the bus, and have not already indicated this, please let us know.

Dress: Please wear comfortable shoes as you may be walking over uneven terrain at times. Dress in layers as the weather in October can have significant temperature swings.

Hosts/Guides: Your official host for the day is Benjamin Gessner, with help from Coral Moore.

Lunch: Box lunches catered by Nelson's Cheese Mart will be provided at the National Eagle Center. In order to stay on schedule, participants will have 30 minutes to enjoy their lunches at the Eagle Center then will need to bring the rest of their lunch to be finished on the bus. We recognize that some people have special dietary needs and we have done our best to ensure there is something for everyone.

Phone Charging: Since this is an all-day tour, ATALM will have a few USB chargers available for loan. You will need to bring your phone cord. Please check with the tour hosts for availability.

Schedule: It takes about two hours to travel to the National Eagle Center and we are scheduled to arrive around 10 a.m. Upon arrival, participants will experience an eagle presentation by staff then will have some time to explore the exhibits and meet the live eagles in the center's care. The bus will depart the National Eagle Center promptly at 12:30 p.m. to head to Prairie Island Indian Community where participants will receive a tour of the Buffalo Project. Travel time is approximately one hour to Prairie Island Indian Community. The bus will depart to head back to Shakopee promptly at 3 p.m.
