To earn the **Fund Raising for Cultural Institutions Certificate**, you must do the following:

1. Submit a brief [application](#). Once your application is approved, you will receive additional information on the pre-conference webinars.
2. Participate in at least 15 hours of training, including a minimum of five self-paced webinars in advance of the conference, one full-day workshop on October 9, and two conference sessions specific to the certificate being earned on October 10 and 11.
3. Work with a cultural institution of your choice to complete a fund raising plan or other project specific to fund raising.
4. Complete an evaluation survey and write a brief report.

Certificates will be provided after your special project and report are received.

In the event there is a conference session you wish to attend that is not a part of the programs listed below, you may substitute a webinar. The goal is to ensure a minimum of 15 hours of training in whatever format best works for you.
