



Mille Lacs Museum and Trading Post Tour Tuesday, October 9, 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m.

You are receiving this message because you are registered for the ATALM-sponsored “Field Trip to Mille Lacs Indian Museum and Trading Post” scheduled for Tuesday, October 9 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. To read more about the tour, please refer to the conference program book available at www.atalm.org, page 9, tour 6.

Attendees: Approximately 52 people are on the tour. To help you acquaint yourself with your fellow attendees, a roster may be found at the end of this message.

Bus: The tour bus will leave from the front of the Mystic Lake Casino and Hotel at 8:15 AM, please plan on being at the bus to begin loading at 8 AM. Look for the bus with the “Mille Lacs Indian Museum” sign. **The bus will not be held for late comers, so please be sure to be on time. Refunds are not available.**

Food and Beverage: You are permitted to bring beverages and food on the bus, but the bus company requests that you do not leave trash. If you are not taking the bus, and have not already indicated this, please let us know.

Dress: The museum tends to stay pretty cool, so dress in layers as the weather in October can have significant temperature swings, and we will be outside for a portion of the reservation tour.

Hosts/Guides: Your official guide for the day is Travis Zimmerman.

Lunch: A traditional lunch of walleye or chicken, a wild rice dish, a veggie, pumpkin bars, fry bread and beverages will be served.

Phone Charging: Since this is an all-day tour, ATALM will have a few USB chargers available for loan. You will need to bring your phone cord. Please check with the tour hosts for availability.

Schedule: The tour is scheduled for Tuesday, October 9th. It takes about two hours to get to the museum so you should arrive around 10 AM. Upon arrival, we will do a walking tour of the site, then you will be divided into three groups and circulate among three areas of the site, the Main Exhibits area, the Four Seasons Room and the Trading Post. Lunch will be from 12:30-1:30 PM. We will then have a short tour of the collections area before departing the museum at 2:00 PM for a tour of the reservation and then we will headed back to the hotel at 2:30 PM, arriving at about 5 PM.

Ticket: In your registration name badge, you will find a ticket for the tour. This ticket must be kept with you throughout the day and presented when boarding the bus and at lunch.
